### **NHS England Guidance on Remote Prescribing**

NHS England has published specific guidance on the remote prescribing of medication in health and justice (HJ) sites as a result of virtual/remote consultations with patients. The guidance states that prescribers should be aware of the processes for prescribing responsibly remotely and also advises providers to have written procedures underpinning how remote prescribing is undertaken. Processes have been described separately for controlled drugs (CDs) and Non-CDs. Access the full guidance (here)

#### **Community Pharmacy Update**

Many pharmacies are currently operating within restricted hours to allow them time to recover, clean and ensure that they can process prescriptions in a safe and timely manner. Most pharmacies are also following the **amended hours** below as requested by **NHS England**; however, these times may vary locally and some pharmacies may be open different times to this.

- 10am-12pm and 2pm-4pm
- 10am-12pm and 2pm-6pm

## Care Homes - Changing from Medicines Dispensed in Monitored Dosage Systems (MDS) to Original Packs (OP)

Due to the extra workload, community pharmacies may no longer be dispensing medicines into MDS for care homes. There is no clear evidence that the use of MDS improves the safety of administration of medicines or reduces errors. Guidance has been made to community pharmacy and care homes where a change to using original packs is to be made:

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Any change to the way medication is supplied by a pharmacy to a care home should not affect the process of requesting medication or the issuing of repeat prescriptions from practices.

#### **Epimax - Name Change**

There have been recent changes to the Epimax product range and these changes have affected EMIS much faster than anticipated resulting in the original product names being deleted from the system, despite each maintaining a dual listing on the drug tariff until February 2021.

The update affects the three products listed below. The manufacture has confirmed that the products remain unchanged:

- EPIMAX<sup>®</sup> Original Cream (previously Epimax Cream)
- EPIMAX<sup>®</sup> ExCetra Cream (previously ExCetra Cream)
- EPIMAX<sup>®</sup> Isomol Gel (previously Isomol Gel)

#### Shortages Update

Clenil 100mcg Inhaler*	<ul> <li>The manufacturer has confirmed enough Clenil 100mcg inhalers have been released into the supply chain throughout April and similar supplies are expected in May. This is substantially more than they would normally supply, and should be enough to meet demand.</li> <li>Some areas may still be experiencing shortages due to: <ul> <li>Pharmacy quotas, meaning they can only order a few at a time</li> <li>Supply issues to the smaller independents maybe challenging as larger pharmacy chains have been given priority</li> <li>Delays in delivery, which is affecting all sectors of retail</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Soprobec 100mcg and 200mcg Inhalers*	The manufacturer is experiencing unprecedented demand. Their next batch of 100mcg and 200mcg inhalers will be released at the end of April.	
Metformin SR [Sukkarto] 500mg Tablets		

\*Clinicians can help to improve the supply chain by ensuring that the prescribed quantities of each inhaler type do not exceed 28 day treatment each time.

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
